PROGRAMS AND AWARDS

Introduction to Research for International Young Academics

Held during the RSNA Scientific Assembly and Annual Meeting, this program encourages radiologists in the early stages of their research career—residents, fellows, and radiologists up to 2 years beyond training—from countries outside the United States and Canada to pursue careers in academic radiology.

Application Deadline: April 15

International Visiting Professor Program

Up to four teams of two or three visiting professors are sent to lecture at national radiology society meetings and satellite institutions with radiology residency training programs in developing or newly developed nations.

Visiting Professor—Candidates should be dynamic, experienced radiology teachers and currently hold an academic appointment in North America or other developed country.

Visiting Professor Application Deadline: Ongoing

Visiting Professor Hosts—National Radiology Societies serving developing nations are invited to apply to host a team of visiting professors to lecture at their society meeting. Selected societies will organize visits to educational institutions with active radiology training programs that can benefit from a visiting professor team.

Host Society Application Deadline:

- December 31, 2011 for 2013 visits
- December 31, 2012 for 2014 visits
- December 31, 2013 for 2015 visits, etc.

The Radiological Society of North America (RSNA®) is the authoritative source for the most relevant, cutting-edge science and education in radiology. These programs, grants and awards are offered in an effort to make the best in science, research and education available globally.

Derek Harwood-Nash International Fellowship

This fellowship allows an international institution to benefit by sending a faculty member to study for a 6 to 12-week period in North America. Interested candidates must be promising radiology scholars who are 3 to 10 years out of training, and who demonstrate that their educational goals can be met most appropriately by study in a North American institution. RSNA covers travel expenses and modest living expenses during study period.

Application Deadline: July 1

Education Materials and Journal Award Program

Radiology teaching institutions and medical libraries in developing nations may apply to receive gratis subscriptions to the RSNA journals *Radiology* and/or *RadioGraphics* and/or available RSNA education materials.

Application Deadline: Ongoing (annual)



Other Programs

Education Scholar Grant—provides funding opportunities for individuals with an active interest in radiologic education. Any area of education related to the radiologic sciences is eligible for support.

Application Deadline: January 10

RSNA/AUR/APDR/SCARD Education Research Development Grant—encourages innovation and improvement in health sciences education by providing research opportunities to individuals who are in pursuit of advancing the science of radiology education.

Application Deadline: January 10

Research Seed Grant—enables investigators to define objectives and test hypotheses; the data from these projects will indicate feasibility and appropriateness of the research prior to applying for funds from other agencies.

Application Deadline: January 15

William R. Eyler Editorial Fellowship—provides a radiologist in mid-career the opportunity to further his/her experience in radiologic journalism. The fellow will work with the editors of *Radiology* and *RadioGraphics* and the RSNA editorial staff to learn about manuscript preparation and editing, peer review and journal production, printing, and electronic publishing.
